"High and Tight"

Recently I watched a rerun of "Hard Knocks"- a television show about NFL Football Training Camps. There was a scene where the Tight Ends Coach was advising his player how to hold the ball "high up" and "tight to his chest." At the end of every drill, he would yell at his player "High and Tight!" "High and Tight!" During a scrimmage, the player didn't hold the ball tight enough and a defender stripped the ball away from him. When he got back to the sideline, one of the players handed him the field phone. It was his coach up in the booth who had been watching him. As soon as the player said hello, you could hear the coach yelling through the receiver: "HIGH AND TIGHT!"

The funniest part of the show was when the camera followed the player after practice to the supermarket, to the gas station, and to his house. As he sat in line to pay for his groceries, the manager of the store came by and said: "Make sure you keep the ball high and tight." When he paid for his gas, the cashier said "High and Tight." And when he got home, there was a card from his neighbors who told him good luck this season and to keep the ball "High and Tight."

When the coach was interviewed, he said that he told everyone around his player to encourage him to make the right decisions. He also told them what he needed to work on in practice- that way *everyone* would be involved in making sure the player gets better. When asked why he had done that, the coach simply replied: "The fans want to win as bad as we do. If a player needs to work on something, everybody ought to be involved in helping out."

How many people are aware of what you need help with? In order for any of us to change, we must have those who can make us accountable. And that means others must actually know what troubles us. In all of Paul's letters, he seems to come back to the same principles: *teach and admonish one another* (Col. 3:16); *encourage one another* (1 Thess. 5:11); be *kind and compassionate to one another* (Eph. 4:32); *serve one another* (Gal. 5:13); *Bear with one another* (Eph. 4:2). In the ultimate game of winning and losing, we all should want to win as much as the rest. And if a person needs to work on something, everybody ought to be involved with helping out.

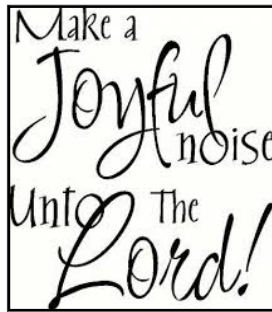
