Final Answer

It was now twenty years ago that Regis Philbin appeared as the host of a new American Game Show—*Who Wants to be a Millionaire?* The Television show ran in prime time for three years before appearing in syndication and eventually being cancelled this year. In the show, contestants who answer all of the questions win a million dollars. In order to make it easier, each question also includes 4 multiple choice answers. The show provided lifelines that help the contestants. They can choose to poll the audience or phone a friend or even eliminate half of possible choices. Even though the contestants have no time constraints, eventually they do have to give an answer if they want to move on. One of the most memorable part of the game is when a contestant chooses his or her answer, Regis would always ask “Is that your final answer?” And once those words—“final answer”—have been given, there’s no going back. They answer they choose is the answer that is given.

There are many reasons I liked this game. One of them is that it mirrors life. We all have choices. Some of us have lots of choices. Sometimes two choices look like good options, but only one can be chosen. However, at the end of the day..we have to make a choice. We too must choose a final answer. And once we choose it, we have to commit ourselves to it.

The Bible presents us with many stories where God called his people to make their final answer. Joshua told his people to “Choose this day” who they would serve (Josh 24:14-15). In Jeremiah, God told his people to “call for me” (Jer 33:3). In Romans, Paul tells his readers to “pursue what leads to peace” (Rom. 14:19). Over and over, the people are called to give an answer and to make a choice. But like the game show, in the end we all have to give a final answer. We have to make a choice and stick with it no matter the consequences.

Part of life is learning what to choose. The other part of life is learning to live with what is chosen. Let us take our time in thinking about what we choose. Let us weigh our options, phone our friends, seek wise counsel, and do what it takes to eliminate all of the bad choices that are placed in front of us. But in the end..we have to choose. And once you do... don't look back.
