# *In All Things, Give Thanks*

While checking out at Walgreens, I noticed that the store was already setting up displays for Christmas decorations. When I was growing up, I never remember seeing any Christmas items until after Thanksgiving. It seems like every year, retail outlets start putting them out earlier and earlier. As I looked at the tree lights and singing reindeer, I thought “What’s the rush?”

But it’s not just the Christmas decorations that start early. I have a tendency to rush into almost everything. If I am preparing for something, I rush it. If I am waiting for something, I want to go to the early show. If there is a big game coming on in two weeks, I will concentrate on that one game and not pay attention to the other games that come on before it.

The act of rushing does two things. First, we take away some of the job of today while concentrating on tomorrow. Have you ever noticed how tired of the Christmas Season you are by the time it actually arrives? The earlier we start our celebrating, the more it loses luster. However, the other thing rushing does is that it makes us less prepared for what is ahead. When we hastily arrange our priorities or when we cram everything into one space or time, it will spell disaster.

Solomon wrote “*Careful planning puts you ahead in the long run; hurry and scurry puts you further behind*” (Prov. 21:5). It’s true within all seasons and situations. Things that are planned are more organized. But when we rush those plans, we miss what’s right in front of us. So as we plan our next few days and weeks, the time will come when we will need to give attention to lights, carols, and the New Year. But not today. Let us enjoy the time we have with those we have...while we have them.
